Utilize these techniques to craft a "page-turning" screenplay.

Cliffhangers : End scenes with suspense or tension.	Emotion: Elicit strong emotions with key story moments.
Character Depth: Create unique, multi-dimensional characters.	Dynamic Dialogue: Keep dialogue sharp, distinct, and full of subtext.
High Stakes: Make the outcome important for your characters.	Visual Writing: Use compelling, visual descriptions.
Promises & Payoffs: Set up early promises and deliver satisfying payoffs.	Dramatic Irony: Use dramatic irony to create tension and engage readers.
Conflict: Include obstacles in every scene.	Twists: Surprise readers with unexpected plot developments.
Clear Goals: Give your characters clear, compelling goals.	Time Pressure: Add a ticking clock or deadline to increase urgency.
Relatable Themes: Use themes that resonate personally with readers.	Fast Pacing: Keep scenes and dialogue concise and impactful.
